Current projects being explored for Bourke Street include improvement to street lighting - Essential Energy have undertaken street light maintenance works along Bourke St to correct lighting deficiencies. Essential Energy have also

commenced the design process to replace suspension lights throughout Wagga Wagga with pole mounted LED lighting (including the the lighting issues along Bourke Street, Lake Albert Rd and Gurwood Street). , - improvements to pedestrian facilities - Council staff have been working on a Safer Roads Program grant application since early June 2021. Bourke Street pedestrian crossing at the Tolland Shopping Centre is potentially eligible for an upgrade as it has been identified as a dangerous black spot location (accident clusters). Concept plans are being drafted for comment by TNSW. The proposed upgrade will include pedestrian operated traffic lights (discussions have taken place with TNSW in this regard with positive feedback). Additional locations along Bourke St will also be investigated due to the road being 4 lanes wide., Bourke ST is part of the Transport for NSW road network (being a Regional Road) and lighting is under the control of Essential Energy. Therefore significant consultation will be required with all stakeholders prior to any works being confirmed. , Whilst there are multiple factors to take into consideration; one safety feature that has been introduced already is the installation of a 40kph speed zone (during school pick up and drop off times) for the majority of Bourke Street between Red Hill Road and Fernleigh Road.
