The new design will allow for lots of varied performance and function spaces which is great. In some distant future, I think the city needs a huge venue (holding up to 2000 people) which can entice top shelf bands and other performers to the city. It would also act as a venue for school formals and large civic functions. A school formal for example needs room for 600 people seated for a meal. (Parents, teachers, graduating students.)	We do a school musical at the Civic Theatre every second year. It is exorbitantly expensive to hire the theatre for the two weeks but the opportunity for our students to experience performing in a professional performing venue means it is an expense we have to live with. Perhaps the smaller venues will be cheaper and more accessible for us in the future. As a theatre-goer, I am looking forward to having a variety of activities to attend in the new centres. LiveBetter/Carer Gateway have a licensed agreement with Wagga Council to lease the building at 1 Fitzmaurice st, we have been in the premise for many years first to support the Community Resource Centre, then to provide support to families and children in the community. We currently use the building for Carer Gateway a National Government funded program to support unpaid carers in Wagga and the surrounding communities. The centre has become a wonderful drop in centre for carers and we also run carer groups from the space. Carer love the accessibility of the building and it's lovely surroundings, we run		The main negative impact we have is the proposed demolition of the building 1 Fitzmaurice St. We have been working closely with Claire from the Civic Theatre to be able to offer different events to our carers, we recently had a group of Young Carers and their families attend the Flying Fruit Circus, everyone loved it and had such positive feedback. We feel the overall plan to extend the Theatre is positive for the community just not the demolition of our building to make another green space, the building is more valuable as a community resource. We hope to encourage and support more carers, families and their recipients to access the theatre and special events in the future.	We would like you to consider not demolishing the building at 1 Fitzmaurice and leave it for us to continue to support the community especially the more vulnerable and disadvantage members of the Wagga community 'the unpaid carers'. They need an accessible safe space to meet, feel heard and take the time to care for themselves while meeting people in similar situations which is what they receive in this building. Our staff in Wagga are dedicated to supporting their community and with LiveBetter and Carer Gateway for many years.
