# TARCUTTA, LADYSMITH AND URANQUINTY FLOODPLAIN RISK MANAGEMENT STUDIES AND PLANS (VOFFS)

The Chair noted the intent today is to reach a decision on whether to recommend to Council to put the VOFFS on public exhibition.

Councillor Vanessa Keenan joined the meeting at 1.10pm and commenced as Chair at 1.12pm. Felix Taaffe, from GRC Hydro, provided a brief summary of the VOFFS process, next steps, and the draft consultation program.

#### Overview

- study findings and recommended options were presented at the December 2019 FRMAC meeting
- a draft report was provided to DPIE and Council in February 2020
- GRC Hydro updated the report based on DPIE and Council feedback

## Next steps

- report provided to Councillors
- draft report approved for public exhibition
- public exhibition period
- submissions and feedback from public exhibition process collated and addressed by Council and GRC Hydro
- final report prepared

## Draft consultation program

- updates via Council communication channels with details on information sessions – flood futures, main website, local media/newspaper
- provide report hard copies for public access
- one on one meetings with interested residents in each village
- each meeting to involve two GRC Hydro staff and Council staff to answer questions and record feedback

## Discussion and feedback

The Committee discussed the report contents at length, seeking clarification from GRC Hydro representatives (Felix Taaffe) on several matters, and requesting/suggesting some modifications to the draft report. Below is a summary of those matters and suggested modifications.

# Uranquinty

- topographical depression between the railway and highway bridge
- raising the level of the bund at Gate 5
- concerns over increased flow into the creek
- queries regarding Uranquinty mitigation measures (UL01, UL04, UL10) and what those measures would comprise
- breach of Churches Plain levee during February 2021 flood event and potential to raise culvert
- feasibility of using portable pumps recommend a permanent pump at the Morgan/Bridge Street area
- recommend new drain along Yarragundry Street, past the new development
- query whether full levee upgrade is the solution if so, the next step would be
  a feasibility study, enabling details to the thrashed out regarding pumps, drains
  and other measures

#### Tarcutta

- suggest rectifying uneven crest on existing levee
- query regarding recommended option and close scoring between TL04 and TL06 – GRC Hydro comfortable with revisiting the recommendations in light of what residents want

# Ladysmith

no specific comments

#### General discussion

- discussion on the scoring used and whether the Committee ought to review scores
- agreement on scores is desirable Committee to review scoring
- discussion on poor uptake/response to questionnaires and lack of engagement from Ladysmith and Tarcutta communities
- note that relationship with SES is crucial when dealing with (flood) problems
- careful management of the communication process through public consultation is crucial – the public cannot be expected to easily dissect the volume or complexity of information
- query around the freeboard (not dictated by VOFFS, but it is specified in MOFFS) – confirm the intent is to be consistent across the two
- note some of page number in the report table of contents do not match up
- query regarding inclusion of projects in Council's Long Term Financial Plan –
  note that next round of DPIE grants is open (closing 18 March) with staff working
  on selected projects for funding. VOFFS projects will external funding before
  they go into the LTFP

# Community consultation

 of the 93 responses, 64 provided a response regarding preference for voluntary house raising and voluntary house purchase – no discernible patterns (no clustering, not geographic), showing it tends to be a highly personal matter

# Public exhibition strategies

- report available for comment for a minimum of 28 days
- advertised through Council's media channels and report available via website
- original brief allowed for three face to face public information sessions; however, in a COVID-19 context this will likely need to be based on a booking system for small groups
- · range of feedback methods available
- strategy to be refined with Council's communications team
- following exhibition period, feedback will be considered and report finalised

## Discussion and feedback

The Committee discussed the report contents at length, seeking clarification from the WMAwater representative (Erin Askew) on several matters, and requesting/suggesting some modifications to the draft report. Below is a summary of those matters and suggested modifications.

#### Lake Albert and Glenfield Drain

- these schemes will have significant public attention/interest
- consider the effects of using the lake for surcharged on nearby infrastructure (i.e. boat sheds)
- will require a feasibility and detailed design study for Lake Albert the recommended measure is raising Lake Albert Road to create additional air space for storage
- permanent level of lake could potentially be kept higher
- how to preserve lake air space? (weir option)

## Railway

- consider effects of light of railway line lowering for Inland Rail expense and difficulty in closing railway for any flood mitigation works; can works be timed to align with ARTC work?
- consult with ARTC during the exhibition period

# General discussion

- recent storm event supports the Crooked Creek diversion as a high priority (the creek kept running for a reasonable time after the storm, where Stringybark Creek ceased flow within hours)
- WMAwater can provide an excerpt of the scoring process for the Committee to review and consider
- recommend a 'mythbusting' response be ready and available as soon as the report is ready for public exhibition
- discussion on scoring, ranking, and priority in table potential for confusion and/or inaccurate assumptions
- WMAwater can remove ranking to avoid these issues
