The proposed upgraded would include pedestrian operated traffic lights, discussions have taken place with TNSW in this regard with positive feedback). Additional locations will also be investigated due to the road being 4 lanes wide., Options to improve the safety and amenity of the road for pedestrians and drivers include the above.				

The road is part of the Transport for NSW (Regional Road) network and lighting is under the control of Essential Energy therefore both sites require significant consultation with all stakeholders prior to any works being confirmed.

Whilst there are multiple factors to take into consideration; one safety feature that has been introduced already is the installation of a 40kph speed zone (during school pick up and drop off times) for the majority of Bourke Street between Red Hill Road and Fernleigh Road.
